GARDEN DISPLAY

Garden Displays shall consist of six specimens of each small vegetable or fruit, one specimen of each large vegetable, and not less than one pint of each variety of canned fruit and vegetables. Displays will be judged according to number of fruits and vegetables included, and quality and condition of each. Exhibits can include fresh, dried, and canned vegetables, fruits, herbs — anything grown in vegetable gardens. Each item must be named. Table space will be approximately 3 feet by 3 feet.
